



## Saint Anne's Parish Calgary Alberta

### Establishment and Early Organizers

When the railway arrived in 1883, Calgary had a population of 500, and the only parish was the Cathedral Parish of St. Mary's. Because St. Mary's was too small for the growing population and too far away for the people living on the eastern side of town, it was suggested at a Parish meeting held on May 3, 1908, that a chapel should be erected in East Calgary.

The organization of the Parish was spearheaded by Mr. Tom Burns and Mr. Owen Colton. Other pioneers of St. Anne's Church included John Monaghan, Bernard Barry, Albert Barry, William King and Mr. Lussier.


The first mass in East Calgary was in a small store on nineth avenue, between 11th and 12th St. on November 8, 1908, and was offered by Rev. L Culiere O.M.I. then an assistant at St. Mary's. Father Culiere was replaced shortly afterwards by Father Lestane O.M.I.

The growing population soon found the store too small, so for a time mass was said upstairs in Haskins Hall, on the north side of 9th Ave. between 12th and 13th St. East.

### First Church and Priests

(The growing population) The next move, about the beginning of 1909, was to a vacant store at the corner of 9th Ave. and 12th St.E. Each Sunday, one of the Oblate Fathers from St. Mary's, Father





Lestanc, most of the time, came down to say Mass.


The first church was built at 8th Ave. and 14th St. E., and the new edifice was opened on Sunday, August 8th, 1909 with Fathers Jan and Nelz officiating. The construction took place under the supervision of Mr. Colton, who was a carpenter. It was paid for when it was built. On April 24, 1910, Bishop Legal blessed the church apparently with a simple blessing. The Curates of St. Mary's attended St. Ann's until December 11, 1911 when Bishop Legal formally confided St. Ann's parish, which he had erected a year earlier (Dec. 16, 1910) as a canonical parish and a civil corporation, to the community of priests known as the Priests of St. Mary of Tinchebray. The Holy See approved their acceptance of the parish in January 1912. Rev. L. Forget, later Msgr. Forget, a secular priest and Rev. L. Anciaux were the first to take charge of the Parish. About 1913, Father Forget wanted to go to Rome, so Father Ciron and Father Chauvin were sent to take charge of St. Ann's. It was in 1913 that the Church was moved to 21st Ave. S.E.


In July, 1916, the Community of Priests of St. Mary of Tinchebray asked to be released from the parish, so the Community left St. Ann's on Nov. 30, 1916. Rev. W.E. Cameron became the first secular priest pastor in December 1916. In 1919 Rt. Rev. J.S. Smith was appointed pastor to succeed Father Cameron. In 1924 Msgr. Smith was transferred to St. Mary's and Rev. A.E. Rouleau succeeded as pastor of St. Ann's. Rev. V. Dargan was appointed Pastor in 1932, and during the summer of 1939 Fathers Holland



and Violini helped out until Rev. E.L. Doyle was appointed pastor in September 1938. About 1943 Rev. J. McLaughlen came to St. Ann's. Rev. F.R. Mongeau came in 1948 to assist Father Doyle and was the first appointed assistant in the parish. He stayed until June 14, 1954 when he was replaced by Rev. Rupert MacLellan who stayed until June 29, 1960. Msgr. Doyle died suddenly on August 5, 1959 and Very Rev. Joseph E. LeFort C.S. was appointed pastor on Sept. 20, 1959. Rev. F.P. Van Tighem replaced Father MacLellan temporarily during the summer of 1960 after the latter left on June 29, 1960. Rev. Micheal Tansey was appointed assistant in September of that same year. Father Gyorkos replaced Father Tansey on June 10, 1964. Rev. J. Smith replaced Msgr. LeFort on Sept 3, 1967 and Father Gyorkos was moved to Drumheller.



New Church

1958 marked another milestone in the history of St. Ann's Parish. On June 30 Monsignor Smith, former Pastor of St. Ann's laid the cornerstone for the new St. Ann's Church. This impressive



brick edifice is situated between the old church and the new rectory. On the last Sunday after Pentecost, Nov. 23, 1958, the blessing of the new St. Ann's Church took place. Monsignor Doyle was Pastor at the time. The Architect was J. Stevenson and Associates and the builder Jason Construction. The Cost of the new building was 71,180.



### Bell

The bell which was borrowed from a set purchased for St. Mary's Church, and apparently still "on loan" was transferred from the old church to the tower of St. Ann's new church. The inscription on the bell is as follows:

### Parish Hall

The old church, after fifty-five years of use first as the church and then as a parish hall (since 1958), was demolished on Sept. 15, 1965 to leave room for construction of a new St. Ann's Parish Hall. It was on this occasion that a memorial booklet of the Parish History was written. A few copies are still available.

Separate School

Father Forget worked very hard to get a school for St. Ann's so the School Board gave him a school which would be held in the small room over the vestry. It was officially opened on Aug. 1, 1909 and Miss Ethel MacDonald was appointed teacher. As the classes increased in number, more room was needed so a one room school with a basement was built attached to the Church. By 1911 there was a great influx of immigrants and Easterners to Western Canada. Two years after the building of the Church there were 600 people attending Mass, so the Separate School Board commenced a new four room school the same year on the present location of St. Ann's school at the corner of 21st avenue and 9th Street S.E. Two of the rooms were opened in 1912 and another four rooms were added about 1918. In 1954 an auditorium was added to the school and in the following year a new Junior High School section. The original section of the school was replaced by a new addition in 1967.

Religious Communities

The Religious Communities of priests have been mentioned earlier under the heading of "First Church and Priests".

When the diocese of Calgary was established on Nov. 30, 1913, there was only one Community of religious teachers, the Sisters Faithful Companions of Jesus.

About 1913, Father Ciron arranged for the Soeurs de la Charite de N.D. d'Evron to make a foundation in St. Ann's as teachers.



However, this was never realized and it was not until 1919 that Bishop McNally succeeded in getting the Sisters of St. Joseph of Peterborough to accept his invitation. Eight Sisters arrived in September 1919 and took up residence in the house of the Tinchebray Fathers Residence at 922 - 21st Avenue S.E. which was re-named St. Ann's Convent. The Sisters taught in St. Ann's and Sacred Heart Schools until June 1921. The Ursuline Sisters taught for a short time in St. Ann's School while they were using St. Ann's Convent as a temporary quarters until December 1923. They then moved to their residence in Southwest Calgary. While they were residents of St. Ann's Convent they renamed it The Ursuline Novitiate.

After the Ursuline Sisters moved, Bishop Monahan was unsuccessful in placing novices in St. Ann's Convent so the Sisters Faithful Companions of Jesus began teaching in St. Ann's School, and except for a short time, 1968-1970, some of the Sisters have remained there to this present time.

In the meantime, the Convent was used for a Rectory until 1951 when a new Rectory was built and the Sisters Adorers of the Precious Blood from Edmonton purchased the building and renovated it to be their Monastery. These Sisters have resided there until August of this year, 1971, when they sold the building to private individuals in preparation for moving into their new Monastery on Cemetery Hill in South Calgary in the near future.



To all who will see our present Letters We make it known that; to the glory of God and for the spiritual welfare of some Catholic people *of the Latin Rite*, in communion with the Holy Roman See, and under the supreme jurisdiction of our Holy Father the Pope of Rome, settled and living in the ~~+ Emp~~ *vicinity of the place known as the city of Calgary.*

We have decided to institute and, by these Our official Letters, we do canonically institute a Catholic Parish under the title and under the invocation of St *S<sup>t</sup> Ann*, celebrated on the *26<sup>th</sup> day of July* as the Catholic Parish of *St. Ann, Calgary*.

and we hereby appoint & assign as limits of said Parish of St Ann, Calgary.

(1) On the North, Commencing at the point where the Elbow River meets the Bow River; then following the Bow River towards the East, including the Islands and Specially St. Georges Park;

(2) On the East, following the same Bow River as far as the line of the City Limits south of Section 12<sup>th</sup>;

(3) On the South, following the City limits towards West at the Southern boundary of Sections 12<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> as far as the MacLeod trail.


(4) On the West, following the MacLeod trail, in a North-easterly direction, as far as a line crossing the Elbow River due South at the eastern extremity of a small Island south of the Exhibition Ground, then following said line to the Elbow River, then following the Elbow River to the point of

And the said Parish of St Ann, Calgary.

We declare to be now and to fully remain in future, at least until otherwise regulated by the Holy See, under Our spiritual direction or the jurisdiction of Our successors, or of the Administrator of the Diocese for the time being; with the obligation for the Parish Priest or assistant priests or missionaries who shall be appointed by us or by Our successors or by the Administrator of the Diocese for the time being, or by their religious superiors with Our consent, the consent of Our Successors or of the Administrator of the Diocese, to entirely conform with the Regulations and ecclesiastical discipline of the Diocese of St. Albert in all that pertains to the administration of the Sacraments, according to their own Rite, the preaching of the word of God, and otherwise ministering to the spiritual wants of the faithfuls of said Parish of St. Ann, Calgary.

And we bid and command the said parishioners to faithfully pay to their Pastor and priests the support and dues, in accordance with the authorized practices, customs and tariffs which will be in force in this Diocese, for the decent and convenient sustenance of the Clergy and the maintenance of the church and other parochial buildings. And We command them also to show always respect and obedience to their Pastor and priests in all things that concern religion, their spiritual welfare and their eternal salvation.

And by the sole fact of this canonical erection, do we issue these Letters of the Parish of St. Ann, Calgary.





said Parish becomes a body corporate of the same name, that is "The Corporation of the  
Catholic Parish of St. Ann, Calgary,"

in virtue of an Act of the Legislature of the North West Territories, No. 32 of the year 1895 which is "An Ordinance to incorporate the Catholic Parishes or Missions of the Diocese of St. Albert". As amended by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Alberta No. 42 of the year 1909.

"And the said Corporation shall be administered in accordance with the tenor of the said Ordinance, as amended.

by a Council composed of the Bishop of St. Albert as president, of the priest appointed by him to have charge of said parish and of two parishioners, as Church Wardens, approved of by the Bishop; and no proceedings or transactions shall be deemed legal, without the consent in writing and the signature of the Bishop and the seal of the Corporation.

And these Our official Letters shall be solemnly read and published during the celebration of Holy Mass, at the first meeting of the congregation, after they shall be received.

And a copy shall be kept in the records of said Parish and another in the Episcopal Residence of St. Albert.

Done at St. Albert, under Our signature the Seal of the Diocese and the countersign of Our secretary on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. nineteen hundred and ten.



We completed plastering the Rectory and then he asked us to plaster basement of church that he could hold card parties that he might pay us. He said he could not ask any outsider of the Catholic Church to do the work. Although we both belonged to the Sacred Heart Church we went to St. Ann's to do the work for him, and paid for all material and labor out of our own pocket. The present Rev. Father has paid us \$25.00 the last three years.

Now Your Lordship we hope we have explained everything satisfactory, and you see your way clear to pay us, as we have had a struggle to live by the building trade this last three years.
