It is understood that a wind stacker requires from four to six horse power to develop its full capacity, according to the size of the machine; and it is thought that most of the threshing outfits with wind stackers, or blowers, have engines of from 18 to 30 H.P.

It would be a useless expense to buy a windstacker if your engine has not power to run it, consequently it will be well to interview parties who have had practical experience, before making any further outlay in that line.
