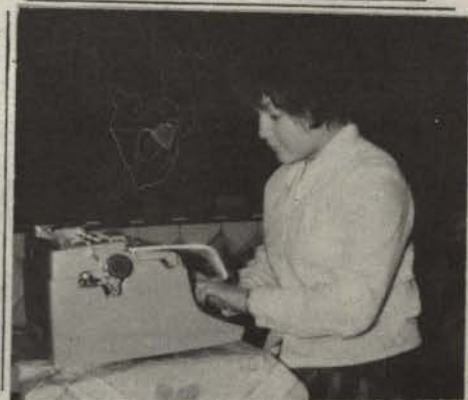

- 2nd place - Michael Coady, Cold Lake

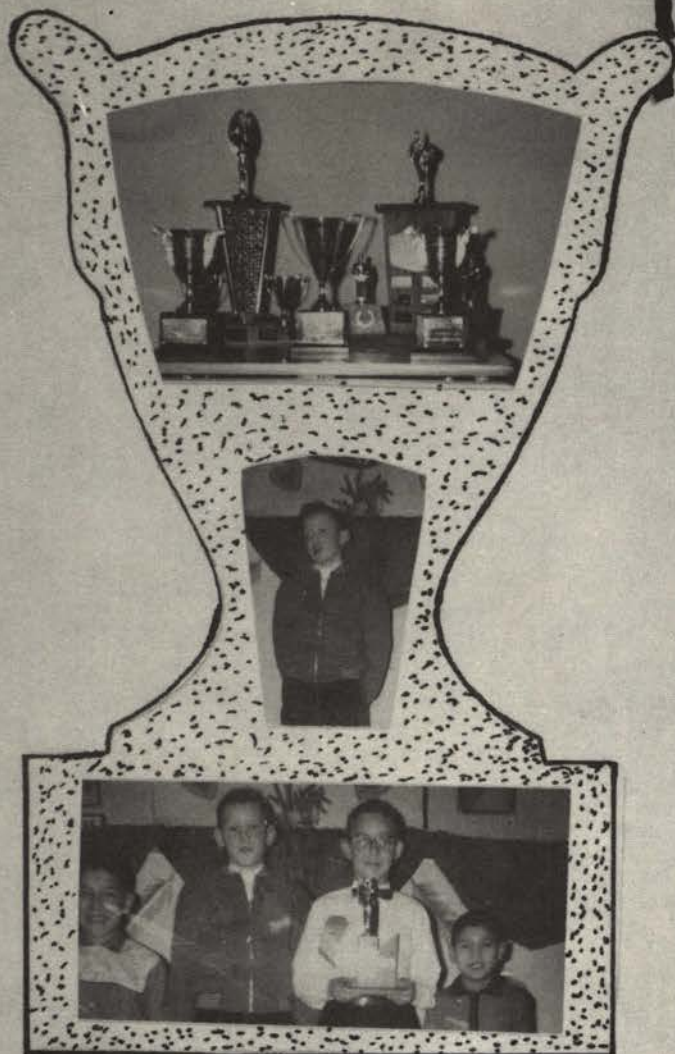
INTER-AGENCY FINALS HELD AT ERMENSKIN RES. SCHOOL MARCH 4
