Dear Sir,

I have your request of the 29th ultimo, for two dozen copies of our latest publication, "Forestry Lessons". I regret that, when arranging for the Superintendent of Indian Education to send out his letter with the first distribution of this booklet, we did not make clear to him that there were certain limitations to our offer of additional copies. As a matter of fact, when planning the publication, we had it in mind to distribute only to the teachers, and it did not occur to us that the wording of the Superintendent's letter might be construed to mean that we would furnish copies to students as well as teachers.

You will appreciate that, since the publication is being furnished to the various provincial public schools, as well as to the Indian schools, it would require a large issue to fill all requirements were we to supply each pupil with a copy. Since each individual copy costs a considerable sum, it is quite beyond our powers with the limited money we have available to undertake such an extensive distribution. Under the circumstances, we find it necessary to limit the distribution to one copy per teacher, with an additional three copies per school, for circulation amongst the pupils, as required. If you will advise me as to the number of teachers in your school, I will be glad to supply you with quantities as stated.

Kindly send also at least two quarts of fluid to partially refill our eight I Quart Fire Guns No 0, which must also be partially recharged once a year.




