



OF THE SECOND PART.

WITNESSETH that in consideration of the rents, covenants and agreements hereinafter reserved and contained by the Lessee to be paid, observed and performed the Lessors do hereby lease unto the Lessee all those certain lands and premises in the Town of Macleod known as Lots numbers Seven, Eight, Nine and Ten on the South side of Twenty Seventh (27th) Street and Lots numbers Seven, Eight, Nine and Ten on the North side of Twenty Sixth (26th) Street all West of Fifth Avenue Macleod together with the brick building thereon known as the Convent.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said demised premises for and during the term of Four Months from the 30th day of August A.D.1909 yielding and paying therefor the monthly rental of Seventy Five Dollars payable all in advance at or before the execution of these presents.

The Lessee covenants with the Lessors that it will pay the said rent and will during the said term use the said premises exclusively for school purposes and will not sublet or assign the said lease.

AND that it will repair the roof of said building and at the end of the term surrender and give up possession of said premises in equally good repair, order and condition as the said premises now are, reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire and tempest excepted.

The Lessors agree that the Lessee may at any time after the execution of these presents construct such temporary partitions etc. within the Convent Building and erect such outbuildings as they may desire and find necessary for the carrying on of

their school work and at the end of ~~the~~ term hereby granted that the Lessee may and shall remove said partitions and erections leaving the premises in like good order and repair as at present as set out in foregoing covenant.

As a guarantee that the Lessee will observe the covenants and agreements as regards repair the Lessee deposits herewith the sum of Two hundred and Fifty Dollars ^{together with interest at three (3) per cent per annum} which ^{sum} the Lessors agree to refund immediately upon the surrender of the said premises in accordance with the terms hereof,

The Lessee further covenants with ~~the~~ Lessors that it will forthwith insure the said premises for the term hereof at their full insurable value with loss payable to the Lessors.

It is hereby declared and agreed that in case the premises hereby demised or any part thereof shall at any time during the term hereby granted be burned down or damaged by fire so as to render the same unfit for the purposes of the Lessee then this lease shall immediately terminate and the rent and the rent apportioned.

It is hereby agreed between the parties that all covenants, agreements and conditions which would be implied under the Land Titles Act with reference to a lease thereunder shall be implied under and attach to this lease.

It is expressly declared and agreed that the Lessors in leasing these premises to the Lessee for School purposes do not in any degree represent that the said premises are suitable, fit or safe for use for School purposes nor that the said premises are in a good or tenantable state of repair and the Lessee accepts and assumes all responsibilities, risk and liabilities arising from any cause, accident or thing connected directly or indirectly with the said building or premises and will save the Lessors harmless and indemnified from and against any claim in the premises.

The Lessors covenant with ~~the~~ the Lessee for quiet enjoyment.

At a meeting of the Trustees of the Holy Cross Separate School I was instructed to write your Order, re-said school.

On September, 20th, 1919, the Trustees of the Holy Cross Separate School, of Macleod, entered in to an agreement with the Oblate Order, to purchase the building known as the Convent Building for the sum of \$2,500, payable annunally.

The Trustees at that time were in affluent circumstances, in so far as the seperate school supporters and tax payers were concerned, sence that time our finances have decreased yearly, so much so at the present time, we are carrying on our school under great financial difficulties, our tax rate for 1925, being 27½ with a probale increase for 1926. Hence we are appealing to your Oblate Order, that you may assist us to continue our school, for ~~that~~ we feel under the heavy burden of the yearly payment to your Oblate Order, that we should be unable to occupy our present school building, thereby forfeiting the sums we already paid and vacate the building.

Should the Oblate Order in their greatness, free us from further payments, by granting us a clear title to the property we can well continue, or ^{and} by granting us a very great reduction in balance owing, (which ^{is} not very large) we are of opinion we can obtain ^{the same} within thirty days by voluntary help and assistance.

On account of the financial conditions, the only thing we can offer is that we are willing to turn this property and building over to any Religious Community of Sisters, free of all debt, providing they will open a school or Convent.

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 4th, with reference to the Agreement of Sale for the School building purchased by your Board in 1919.

While realising your financial conditions compelling you to ask for a cancellation of the balance of the money which you still owe on the building, yet I hope you are not forgetful of what sacrifices the Oblate Fathers have made with regards the Separate School District at Macleod.

Already in 1905, the Oblate Fathers obtained some four lots for school purposes, and purchased four other lots. - With a view of securing the services of some Sisters, a Convent (at least part of a larger plan) was built at the cost of some thirteen thousand dollars, paid by the Oblate Fathers. Unfortunately, no Religious Community of Sisters accepted to come to Macleod. Your School Board in the meantime kept the small school building near the Church grounds; and it was only in 1919 that the School Trustees agreed to purchase our building for the sum of \$2500.00, payable viz. \$200.00 per year and 6 % interest. By May 1925, there was still a balance due of \$1050.00.

On Sept. 25th 1925, Rev. Father Blanchin, then Provincial Superior of the Oblate Fathers, made an Agreement with your School Board that, in order to clear off this unpaid balance, a payment of \$100.00 each year, without any further interest, would be accepted. Nevertheless, not a single payment has since been made. However, you have continued to use this building for your Class-rooms, and having an agreement to that effect, you were certainly interested in keeping this building in good repairs in order to comply with the School Ordinances. And consequently it was no longer up to us to see to the required repairs.

Still the Oblate Fathers are not unwilling to help you under the present circumstances. But considering the great sacrifice of money already made, and feeling also the stringent financial situation, they would like to know whether your School Board could not make some kind of proposition to compensate them before cancelling altogether the outstanding indebtedness.

We are writing you in regard to our agreement of sale for school building purchased September 19th., 1919, for Holy Cross Separate School, District #8, for two thousand, five hundred dollars, (\$2500.00).

We have paid you the sum of \$2078.00 to May 6th. 1925. There is a balance due of ten hundred and fifty dollars, (\$1050.00)

On account of the financial condition our School District is in and the small number of Catholic people holding taxable property, it is almost impossible to keep our school open for the coming year. In fact the taxes received for the past ten years have only been approximately one half enough to pay expenses. At the present time this building is in a very unsatisfactory state of repair and we shall have to spend money on it in order to comply with the requirements for school purposes.

Now what we are asking of you, in order to keep our ~~xxh~~ school open, is for you to cancel the balance of this money which we are owing and give us a transfer of this property so that we may be able to borrow money to make the necessary repairs. This building was never completely finished. It is in such a condition

that it will require quite a sum of money to make these repairs so
that it will not be condemned for school use.



If you wish I shall relinquish the title of that property to you and give you complete ownership of it again, or if you would prefer, I am prepared to put it up for sale, and if I succeed in selling it, to turn over to you the proceeds of the sale as settlement in full of your claim. It might be that the Hutterian Brethern or some other persons might be prepared to buy the building, dismantle it, and use the materials for a building elsewhere. As it stands it will become subject to taxation and will be a constant liability. The lots might as well go back to the Town. However, those are matters for you to decide and I should be pleased to have you let me know what your Order wishes me to do with the property.



Dear Sir:

I expect that before now you have received from Mr. J.W. McDonald a transfer giving you clear title to the former school of the Holy Cross S.D. I thought it best to transfer the property back to you so that you would have complete control of it.

As I promised I have been trying to get an offer for the building. I went to Lethbridge and had a talk with a friend of mine who is a contractor and he was kind enough to come over and look at the building with the idea of getting a buyer for me. Father McGillivray tells me that he has heard that you have other plans for that property, and in case you have the following information might be of use to you.

This contractor estimated that, after allowing for breakage, about 100,000 bricks could be salvaged and that they would be worth about \$5.00 per thousand. He estimated the cut stone at 840 cubic feet and worth about \$200.00. The windows, sashes, doors, and lumber would amount about \$300.00 making a possible total of about \$1000.00. The prices quoted are those that would make it profitable for a man to salvage the materials and haul them away.

I might add that I have notified some of the Hutterites that the building is for sale, but so far I have not had any offers. I have no fund from which to pay the cost of advertizing in the newspapers. If there is anything more that you should like me to do, please let me know, and also I should be pleased to know if you wish me to continue trying to secure a buyer. If I do get an offer I intend to submit it to you and you can then do as you see fit.


Dear Father;-






