SPECIFICATIONS
REPAIRS, CHANGES, AND IMPROVEMENTS
TO BE MADE AT THE
R.C. SCHOOL OF THE PEIGAN RESERVE. ALTA.

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General.

All materials employed in the work specified to be of good quality and all repairs, changes etc to be made as shown on plans or details, and to be completed in a satisfactory manner and within the time limited by the Department.

Building .

All floors in the school building which are not in good conditions to be repaired, and all broken glass to be replaced.

The roof of the fresh air dormitories to be repaired with paroid roofing paper and special cement and the roof of the main building to be carefully examined and all loose or rotten shingles to be replaced so that the roof may be entirely water-proof.

The chimneys of the school building to have a cement cap 9" thick well adjusted to the brick chimneys.

The canvas windows in the dormitories will be repaired according to the accompanying detail by replacing the canvas nailed on the studs by ordinary sashes and window frames. As it is necessary that both recreation rooms and dormitories should be heated in winter a small stove or furnace will be placed in the recreation rooms and brick chimneys constructed in each of these buildings. Two registers 15" x 15" will also be placed in the ceiling of the recreation rooms to allow the heating of the dormitories. All registers to have loover for opening and closing as desired.

Plumbing. Each dormitory to be provide with one w.c. basin Automatic low tank combination operated with push button all to be complete with supply pipes, and other connections required. The return pipe to be 4" cast iron and to be connected in cellar to the 6" vetrified drain pipe.

Each bath rooms in boys and girls quarters to be provided with a cast iron enamelled bath 5 feet long with all the necessary connections, including the back air vents. of proper size.

The sewage water will be drained from the building into a cess-pool or septic tank by a 6" tile pipe starting from the foundation the floor of the cellar. This 6" pipe to have a breather run outside and finishing three feet above grade line with a turned bend etc.

The cess-pool and septic tank will be made to conform to the drawings which will be furnished later. Seperate W.C. buildings for boys and girls is also required each having two rooms well ventillated and placed on septic tank, special instructions will be furnished with the detail plan as to the site of these cess-poo l.

Ventillation.

One 12"gal, iron ventillator of the best quality to be put on roof of each dormitory with attachment ot open or close as desired. The class room to be ventillate by a gal.iron pipe placed in the wall close to the chimney with a register 6" above the floor and to be continued to the roof where a ventillator is to be placed. This gal.iron pipe to be 3" x 18" and well attached to the wall studs

Every window to be provided with screen sashes and the exterior doors with good screen doors having all the necessary apparatus such as locks, spring hinges, etc.

Isolated Hospital.

Plans and specifications will be send later for this construction which was found necessary with this school.

Water supply.

One gal. iron tank 120 gallons will be installed in the second floor so that water may be furnished to the baths and w.c. by gravity. The water to be pumped from the well into this tank by a Meyer two ways pump. Before this tank is put in place it will be necessary to strengthen the floor and partitions so as to be sure that it will carry this tank when full of water.

A neat small building with concrete foundation 3 feet deep and continued two feet above grade line should be built so as to protect the well from surface water and other obscenity.

One will, then, be installed in the second floor as that water may be furnished to the tanks and the water to be pumped from the well into this tank. It will be necessary to strengthen the floor and foundations as to be sure that it will carry this load when full of water.

A cast-iron boiler with concrete foundation will be installed on the second floor above grade line and will be used to heat the water from surface water and other sources.
