# Permit to Cut Hay on Dominion Lands.

I the undersigned Agent of Dominion Lands for the Calgary District, by virtue of power vested in me by the Minister of the Interior, do hereby authorize Mr. A Baesse of Dausburg P. O. under the Dominion Hay Regulations as provided by Order in Council to cut and take for his own use but not for the purpose of barter or sale from above Section 5 Township Range Meridian, the following quantity of Hay, viz:-

One hundred tons  
This Permit is issued in consideration of the sum of Five <sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Dollars, being Dues and office fee, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and in fulfilment by the permittee of the following conditions:-

- 1st. That the statements made in his application for this permit are true in each particular.
- 2nd. That no Hay shall be cut previous to the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1899.
- 3rd. That he shall make on the back hereof, before any person duly qualified to administer an oath, a sworn return of the Hay taken by him from Dominion Lands, and forward the Permit to the Agent of Dominion Lands at Calgary on or before the 1st day of October, 1899.
- 4th. That he shall restrict his cutting to the quantity and limits herein set forth.

The violation of any of these conditions or of any of the provisions of the said Regulations will subject the offender to the penalties therein provided, for cutting Hay upon Dominion Lands without authority.

Up to the present, all the schools situated at some distance from towns have advocated Acetylene Gas, and I should like you to communicate with Mr. L. de Galembert, Agent of the "Sunlight Gas Co. Ltd", 352 Main St. Winnipeg, who upon necessary information will be able to submit an estimate of the cost of setting a plant in your school. The light is a good one, as good if not better than Electric light, and costs less than coal-oil. The cost of setting the plant would be less than half that of an electric plant.


