Rev.Sir.

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No.IO5 of the 26th ultime, in which you state that in your estimates for the present fiscal year you had included an item for raising the roof of the girls building, but that now you find that the foundations and walls of that building might not stand the raising of the whole roof, and you enclose an estimate of the cost of raising only part of the roof.

In reply I beg to say that no provision has been made for the purpose in question. The sum of \$1127.00 has been wated for buildings in connection with your school, composed of the following items:-
