I have received the consent of the Rev. Father Ryan for Angelina to work for Mrs Yeoman.


If she cannot get a chance to come up, I will send for her as soon as possible.



Reverend and dear Sir,-

I have your note of the 2nd. of June. So far as I know there is no definite proposal to move the Roman Catholic Boarding School on the Peigan Reserve to a new site. I think we are all agreed that the present buildings are in a very bad situation but to erect new buildings on a new site would cost a good deal of money. However, in looking forward to the improvement of our establishment for Indian Boarding Schools certainly the Peigan School would be marked as one capable of improvement in the situation and in the character of the building. I do not think it could be improved so far as the devoted spirit of the Reverend Sisters who conduct it is concerned.

We propose to send a competent Architect to inspect the School buildings and to suggest changes and improvements that might be made in them. He will likely arrive some time during the summer.







Bien Cher Monsieur Chéné,

Le R. P. Simard a dû vous écrire au sujet de la nouvelle Ecole qui doit être bâtie cette année sur la Réserve des Piéganés. J'aurais bien aimé vous voir avant que les plans ne soit terminés, mais je pense bien que la chose sera impossible. A défaut de cela, sur la suggestion de M^r Scott lui-même je suis allé voir la belle école de Crowfoot afin de pourrais suggérer les différents changements qu'il y aurait à faire. M^r D. Scott m'a dit que notre école sera bâtie sur le même plan que l'école catholique de Blackfoot Crossing mais qu'elle serait plus petite. Dans ce cas il faudra peut-être changer les dispositions de l'intérieur.

Les dortoirs des garçons sont déjà trop petits, s'ils avaient 1 de plus il faudrait le caser meilleurs qu'au dortoir. J'ai envoyé mes remarques sous un autre pli au Secrétaire qui sans doute doit vous le remettre, si vous travaillez au plan.

Il me semble que les systèmes de chauffage et éclairage devraient être dans une bâtisse à part ce qui donnerait plus de place dans la bâtisse principale. Ceci s'est fait dans l'école protestante des Pied noirs, et je pense qu'ils en sont bien satisfaits.

J'ai demandé aussi qu'il y ait des portes à chaque bout du corridor dans le sous-sol au lieu de les avoir en arrière.

J'espère que vous ferez en sorte de nous donner tous les accommodements possibles dans notre nouvelle école.

2 notre nouvelle École. La bâtisse a besoin d'être bien solide à cause des grands vents que nous avons par ici et Monsieur Scott semblait parti à nous donner une école construite en briques solides. Je n'aimerais pas à avoir une bâtisse en blocs de ciment il paraîtrait que le froid et la chaleur agissent beaucoup sur ces blocs de ciment.

Si vous aviez une chance de venir nous voir avant de faire les spécifications je serai bien heureux de vous voir, mais je crains que le temps ne soit trop court, l'été est déjà bien avancé et il n'y a encore rien de fait.

Que pensez-vous de l'électricité comme système d'éclairage? Il me semble qu'ayant à pomper l'eau dans la maison, le même engin nous servirait d'y ajouter un dynamomètre et un magasin.

J'aime à croire que vous ferez en sorte de nous obtenir tous les accommodements possibles. En attendant croyez-moi votre tout dévoué



Dear Sir,

I beg to suggest some changes to be made in the specifications of the ^{proposed} ~~intended~~ new school to be built at the Peigan Reserve.

Mr. D. Scott asked me to send in these few suggestions before the plan is called for tenders.

- In the basement. —
1. Provide end entrances instead of side ones.
 2. Chimney in Laundry
 3. Cast Iron columns in place of concrete in dining room
 4. Wood floors in basements
 5. Cut out shower bath and dressing and put lavatory in place of it.
 6. Put Indian Reception rooms in place of lavatories
 7. Sinks in dining room.
 8. Put Furnace outside in separate building
 9. Put kitchen in rear in place of furnace and dumb waiter at the end of the kitchen
 10. In front in place of kitchen put Sisters' dining room
 11. More light in ends of basement corners.
 12. Chimney for bake oven.
 13. All counter tops 26" wide.
 14. If gas used expose piping and have plant outside the building.
 15. If electric lighting have conduit wiring. Electric lighting suggested as electricity can be stored while pumping.
- 1st Storey
1. Put water closets in place of stationary room for the use of Recreation room.
 2. Same at the girls end.



- 2 Put visitors Dining room 1' wider.
3. ~~Gate 1' off sitting room~~
4. Altar in oratory Bed room Lavatories
5. ^{3rd. story} Book case in Lavatories
6. Twice as many wash basins wanted in Lavatories of dormitories Dormitory.
7. Make Radiators in ~~at~~ Lavatories, & vestry low enough to permit storm windows to open. Lavatories
& Vestry
8. In rear recreation Lavatories make partitions only 7' high to allow more light in bath rooms.
9. Cut Bath in Lavatory in Boys dormitory in front of Building.
10. Wash basin in Vestry
12. If necessary to make Building smaller it is suggested to keep as much room as possible in the Dormitories that the 2 rooms at each end of the Building be thrown into one room but then it would require a center stairway.
13. Window screens & doors as well as storm windows & doors.
14. Call for tenders for septic tank at the same time as call for tenders for school.
15. Furniture should be made with the finishing before school thrown open so the floors be not damaged by workmen.
16. Eaves troughs and cistern of concrete for soft water.
17. Interior finish should be coast Fir and the stairs hard wood - maple or oak
18. There should be 3 coat work on ~~metal~~ lath for plastering.
19. all wood work natural finish.

Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter No 118153/5 of the 11th inst and at the same time blue prints of the plans of the proposed new boarding school building to be erected on the Pegon and in reply to say that I have carefully examined them and with a few slight changes noted in pencils they meet with my approval. I am returning the blue prints for correction.

These changes I had already suggested on Mr Duncan Scott advise, but I suppose they reached too late. I insist of having a separate building for the boiler, this was suggested by several men of experience. The difference in expenditure would be very little, the fuel room, would have to be added to it.

I have asked for doors at each end of the basement hall. The Indians need rooms when they come and see their children, this is necessary.

The Laboratories should be on the same floor of class rooms and recreation rooms, and I have considered the change important.

I do not mention all the other little changes but they are marked on the blue prints.

Hoping these remarks to be satisfactory
